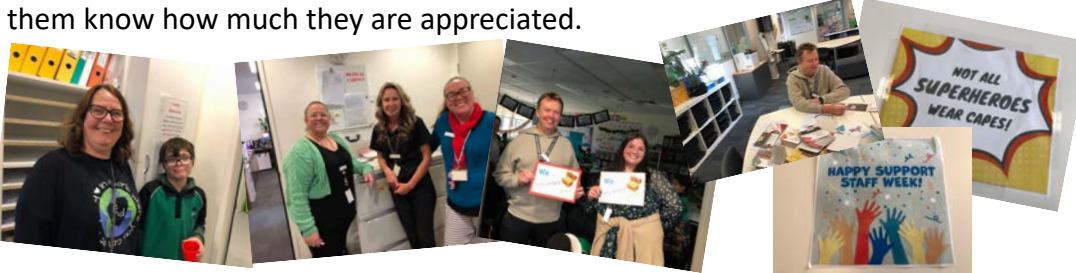

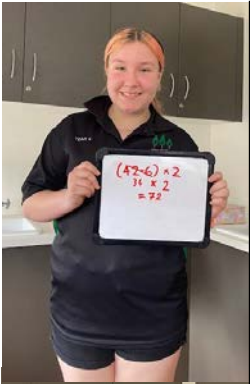
They were given opportunities to develop an understanding of atoms and molecules by making water molecules out of lollies and explored methods for dissolving lollies.

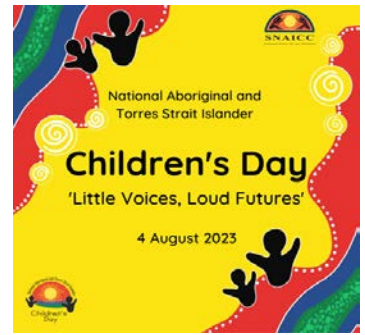

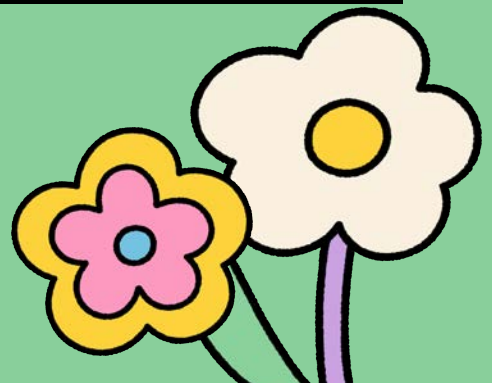
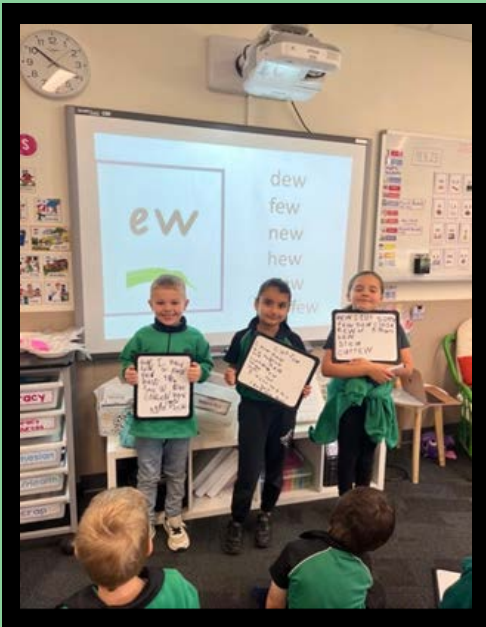
Children's Centre
