Week 8, Term 1, 2024



Dear families,

On Tuesday 12 March the staff at John Hartley participated in professional learning on the Department for Education's recently released Learn and Thrive Strategy.

We unpacked the different elements within the Strategy, which included; the Purpose Statement, Guiding Principles, People and System Levers and the Areas of Impact.

The four Areas of Impact are; Wellbeing, Student Agency, Effective Learners and Excellence and Equity.

Whilst each area is important, as a site we decided to put our focus on the Wellbeing area in the first instance.

Staff worked in collaboration to identify what we are doing well and where we are developing, then further identified four key domains that we required our focus to best the support the needs of our students. This will guide our improvement work throughout 2024 and 2025.

The middle session was spent analysing data from the Wellbeing and Engagement survey which our students in year 4-6 sit each year. This data will also be used to inform and guide our improvement work.

All staff acknowledge that, the wellbeing of our students is paramount to their success as learners, and that student academic achievement is often impacted by a child's level of wellbeing.

Finally, staff were given time in the afternoon to either continue the work from the morning or work in their teams on planning and assessment.

I felt the day was hugely productive and was a great starting point for our ongoing improvement work in; 'wellbeing for learning' and 'learning for wellbeing'.

NAPLAN

This year NAPLAN testing has again been presented earlier than previous years. Moving NAPLAN to term 1 enables schools to access their students' results earlier in the school year, helping teachers to better identify what support students may need and giving teachers greater opportunity to adjust their teaching and learning during the year.

The year 3 and 5 students have participated in Writing, Reading, Language Conventions and Numeracy sections of NAPLAN. We have been so proud of the way our students have participated. Their determination to do well and stamina sitting the tests has been absolutely wonderful!

Week 8 focus: We use appropriate noise level.

 Students will develop an understanding that we use appropriate noise levels depending on adult instructions, the type of learning and the type of learning area so all students can concentrate on their learning without distractions.

- Have a chat to your child/ren about appropriate noise levels within the home. Talk about the different noise levels we may use in different areas of the house or at different times of the day eq. Whisper voice while others are sleeping, louder voice when playing outside.
- Share our school message: When we use appropriate noise levels, we are being respectful of others learning.



Week 9 focus: We use a signal to gain attention.



- Students will develop an understanding that that we can use nonverbal signals to gain an adult's attention when we need to speak to an adult during learning time so that we do not interrupt learning.
- Have a chat with your child/ren about different non-verbal signals we can
 use in school and ones we can use at school. For example. Hands us, T
 sign for toilet etc at school. Thumbs up, down at home.




